

Comptroller's Office Begins Studying Retail **Accountability Program**

Tennessee The Comptroller's Office is looking for feedback as it begins to study the effectiveness and efficiency of Tennessee's Retail Accountability Program (RAP).

The RAP was created by the General Assembly in 2012 to improve sales tax compliance among retailers of beer and tobacco products. The program has since been expanded to include nonalcoholic beverages, soft drinks, candy, and certain nonperish-

able foods.

The program identifies retailers that underreport, either willfully or accidentally, the amount of sales taxes collected and remitted to the state. The Tennessee Department of Revenue compares reported sales of wholesalers to retailers and

audits retailers that do not address noncompliance.

From fiscal years 2013-2023, state has collected \$36,587,304 in revenue as a result of the program.

The Comptroller's Office of Research and Education Accountability (OREA) has released a legislative brief which provides



Robert Brigman, 66, Mason Place Georgia, was charged with Domestic Assault.



(1) (A) Four (4) months from the date of the first publication (or posting, as the case may be) of this notice if the creditor received an actual copy of this notice to creditors at least sixty (60) days before the date that is four (4) months from the date of the first publication (or posting); or

(B) Sixty (60) days from the date the creditor received an actual copy of the notice to creditors if the creditor received the copy of the notice less than sixty (60) days prior to the date that is four (4) months from the date of first publication (or posting) as described in (1) (A); or

(2) Twelve (12) months from the decedent's date of death.




