

Cory Bright, 33, Daniel Road Knoxville, was charged with Simple Possession x2, Disorderly Conduct, Public Intoxication, and Contraband in a Penal Institution.

Deputy Ramsey LCSO, Inmate observing Bright, Cory while he was undressing in the male change out room. The deputy noticed Inmate Bright moving closer to the shower in which he saw him throw out two folded pieces of paper behind the wall while taking off his socks. Inmate Bright appeared to he nervous due to the amount of talking and him shaking. After Inmate Bright was dressed the deputy walked him the the bench in the intake room and proceeded to handcuff him. The deputy then walked back into the male dress out room and picked up two small folded up pieces of paper. The deputy then walked back in behind the intake counter, after

unfolding the pieces of paper the deputy noticed a light brown powder and in the other folded up piece of paper was small white crystals he deputy reported the contents immediately to Sgt. Martin. Sgt. Martin then contacted narcotics to come and test the unknown contents.

Deputy Clay Jenkins was notified and responded to the iail to test the substances with the TruNarc. In one bindle the clear like substance did test positive for Methamphetamine weighing approx. 1.3 grams. In the other bindle the brown powder substance tested positive for Fentanyl and or Methamphetamine Compound weighing 0.8 gram.

At this time the deputy will be charging Inmate Bright, Cory with 2 separate counts of simple possession/ casual exchange and Introduction of Contraband into a Penal Facility. This did occur in the Loudon County Detention Facility, TN.



Edgar Lopez, 35, 4th Avenue Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Simple Possession, License Required, Seatbelt Law.

Officer Parmer LCPD, was dispatched to the area of Hwv 321 and I-75, in regard to a reckless driver. The complainant, a tow truck driver for Cedar Bluff Towing, observed a black Ford F-150, bearing TN tag BRB5252, traveling southbound on I-75 at the 83MM. While behind the vehicle, the complainant observed it swerving all over the roadway. The complainant continued to give updates and follow the vehicle until the officer got behind at Kingston Street and 9th Ave. Once behind the vehicle, the officer observed it cross over the fog line and as it approached the intersection of Kingston Street and 6th Ave, Lt. Butler observed the driver not wearing a seatbelt. A traffic stop was conducted at 5th Ave and A Street, where contact was

made with the driver, identified as 35-year-old Edgar Aranda Lopez. had access to her 8-year-old niece. The defendant wrote that he was interested in sexnal contact with both the notional adult female, the notional 8-year-old, and wanted to include a dog in the sexual contact with them both.

communicating While with the person he believed was an adult female, and, to entice her and the notional 8-year-old, the defendant distributed several videos depicting minors and dogs engaging in sexually explicit conduct. A sexually explicit image of a non-human animal is defined as a "crush video." On July 27, 2023, Bagley traveled to Athens, Tennessee intending to en-

gage in sexual contact with the notional adult female and the notional 8-year-old, and he was arrested.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee and Special Agent in Charge Joseph E. Carrico of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) made the announcement.

This case arose out of a

crimes against children undercover operation which was part of the FBI's annual Operation Cross Country. Law enforcement agencies participating in the joint investigation included the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Shelbyville Police Department, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Red Bank Police Department, Chattanooga Police Department, and the Mc-Minn County Sheriff's Office.








