Kayle Marcum, 22, Copenhaver Road Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession x2, Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence, Poss. of Drug Para., and Contraband in Penal Institution.

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, conducted a traffic stop on a gold Honda SUV for a seatbelt violation (front seat passenger) and a light law violation (both brake lights were not functioning) in the area of A Street at 7th Avenue in Lenoir City, TN. Upon the traffic stop the female passenger was identified to be Kayley Marcum and the male driver was identified as Dylan Parson. While speaking with both subjects the officer noticed signs of nervous behavior. During the roadside investigation the officer requested a Loudon County K9 to respond to his location at which time K9 Investigator Clay Jenkins arrived on scene within a reasonable amount of time. K9 Inv. Clay Jenkins con-

ducted an open-air sniff of the vehicle with his K9 partner Déjà Vu at which time he stated that she alerted to a positive odor of narcotics coming from inside of the vehicle.

A probable cause search of the vehicle was then conducted. During the subsequent search of the vehicle the officer located a green digital scale that contained crystal-like residue on it believed to be methamphetamine residue sitting in the center console of the vehicle. The officer also located an additional scale that had the same crystal-like residue on it in a backpack which was sitting on top of the center console. These scales were located within reaching distances of both parties. Located in the glove box of the vehicle were two orange and white capsule pills labeled (AN 1317) which were identified to be Pregabalin and are registered as Schedule V Controlled Substance. During the time of the investigation there were no prescriptions for the Pregabalin

pills located. The two pills were located within reaching distances of both parties.

The officer also located sev-


eral corner cut bags along with a box of opened sandwich bags where are commonly used to distribute narcotics with.

liveries, which is against the school department policy that he signed.

investigation also The found that Eaves made at least \$1,475.91 in questionable fuel purchases using Hamilton County Schools funds while performing commercial food deliveries.

Eaves was suspended and placed on unpaid administrative leave in May 2022. He requested, and was granted, early retirement, effective July 1, 2022.

Based upon this investigation, in May 2024, the Hamilton County Grand Jury indicted David B. Eaves on one count of theft over \$10,000, one count of forgery over \$10,000, one count of violation of the Tennessee Personal and Commercial Computer Act over \$10,000, one count of destruction of and tampering with government records, and one count of official misconduct.

"Hamilton County Schools officials must ensure they provide adequate of employees oversight

and the department's fuel card usage," said Comptroller Mumpower. "Hamilton County Schools should reconcile fuel purchases on a monthly basis and consider requiring employees to document where they traveled."
