TBI's 'Operation Protecting Tomorrow' Yields Arrests, Identifies Two Dozen Child Online Sexual Exploitation & Sextortion Victims

A dozen people face felony charges and two dozen victims have been identified in a large-scale, collaborative operation to target online child exploitation and sextortion in Tennessee.

Over a three-month period, from February to April, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force, housed within its Cybercrime and Digital Evidence Unit (CDEU), conducted Operation Protecting Tomorrow, with work extending to 21

counties in the state and involving almost 20 local, state, and federal law enforcement partners.

Operation Protecting Tomorrow's purpose was to identify and locate children who were victims of sextortion and online sexual exploitation, along with identifying and arresting individuals who aim to harm children online. These investigations stemmed from cybertips from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC), undercover investigations,

Each year, the FBI investigates thousands of crimes involving hundreds of thousands of victims.

Our Victim Services Division (VSD) informs and assists victims navigating the aftermath of crime and the criminal justice process. One piece of that mission involves coordinated outreach to victims to support their needs, a specialty that falls under the FBI Victim Outreach Support and Strategy (VOSS) Program.

The VOSS team develops and implements strategies to communicate key notifications and resources to victims of crimes investigated by the FBI and to offer opportunities for victims to voice their experiences to law enforcement.

'Our bread and butter is connecting peopleconnecting victims to specialist teams and resources and then connecting investigative teams to victims and giving them a platform to speak," said Benjamin Shannon, VOSS Program manager.

Established in 2017, the VOSS team specializes in outreach in cases with 150 or more


Summer Hayes, 43, Isbill Road Madisonville, was charged with, Theft, Simple Possession, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Officer Sparks LCPD. was dispatched to Walmart in reference to a shoplifting. Prior to his arrival the officer was advised by Dispatch that the suspect was a white female with blonde hair. wearing a white shirt and black pants, and was in Row 7 driving a blue Nissan car. Upon arrival to Walmart, the officer located a blue Nissan Altima, bearing TN registration 548BKHM, in Row 7 operated by a female matching the description provided by Walmart employees. The officer made contact with the driver, Summer Haves, who stated she had been inside of Walmart and an employee did attempt to stop her. Summer's daughter, was inside the vehicle and had also been inside of Walmart with Summer. Summer initially stated she had not stolen any merchandise from Walmart. When conducting a consensual search of Summer's

purse, the officer located two clear, glass pipes and a small glass container containing approximately 0.20 grams of a white crystal substance. When asked about the substance and the pipes, Summer stated that she had let a friend borrow her vehicle recently, but stated that the substance was "probably meth". Also inside the purse were numerous articles of merchandise that appeared to be new. Summer and her daughter were transported to Walmart's AP office where we met with, an employee of Walmart who stated that he observed Summer Haves remove merchandise from its packaging prior to purchasing it, and then conceal the merchandise in her purse. Summer then exited the business and fled to her vehicle. The total value of the stolen merchandise totaled \$73.18. The stolen merchandise was returned to Walmart employees, the two glass pipes were seized and destroyed, and the approximately 0.20 grams of a white crystal substance was seized and logged into evidence.

During the operation, TBI ICAC Task Force Agents identified and located 18 known child victims of sextortion in Tennessee who were reported through NCMEC cybertips reported from several social media platforms, including Snapchat and Instagram. One child victim was identified and located in Alabama. TBI agents are still attempting to

identify and locate an additional 22 children who are victims of sextortion, aged 11 to 17.

As part of the operation, TBI agents executed 10 residential search warrants throughout the state, seizing 181 electronic devices and one child sex doll. An initial preview of these devices has shown more than 264,000 images and videos of Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM). Agents expect the number of images and videos to grow as the examination of evidence continues.

During Operation Protecting Tomorrow, five of the 24 child

victims were identified and rescued as victims of brand-new sexual exploitation content being created by the offender and shared on social media platforms.

victims. They have worked on cases including the Boston Marathon; the Lewiston, Maine, mass shooting; and the Maui wildfires.

Most often, the VOSS team develops "Seeking Victim Information" questionnaires that can be valuable to the investigation and essential to receiving accurate victim contact information. Although they are not meant to supplement interviews, these questionnaires can narrow down a large victim pool to victims most affected by the crime, act as a line of communication to victim specialists, and offer an opportunity in real-time for the FBI to warn victims about ongoing crimes. The VOSS team also creates accompanying web pages with resources, case updates, and other victim-specific support information on fbi.gov. Any of these materials are translated into a foreign language as needed.

By the time most cases reach the VOSS desk, the FBI investigative team may or may not know the specific population of people affected in a case. Cases where the victim population is unknown-called zero victim population cases—require the VOSS team to do a bit of their own detective work: They need to distribute calls for victims to come forward to be able to offer any services and support.

One case involved a schoolteacher who abused children over the span of 20 years in a specific town. Over time, those ed Children (NCMEC) and children may have moved to another city, state, or even another country. As they grew up, their names may have changed. Determining how to reach them in the present day is part of the VOSS team's work.

As the VOSS team strategizes the communications channels that are most likely to reach certain demographics, whether nationally or internationally, they will tap partners across FBI divisions, other government agencies, and private organizations, such as the National Center for Missing and ExploitAARP, to help get the word out and publicize the questionnaires and resource pages. Tactics range from creating posts across social media platforms that potential victims may view to leveraging local and national news out-
