

Jerry Kile, 75, Maple Hill Road Loudon, was charged with DUI, Aggravated Assault, and Leaving the scene of Accident.

Deputy C. Huskin LCSO, was dispatched to Highway 444 and Amohi Way for a hit and run at which time dispatch advised the suspect vehicle fled the scene and crash into the ditch at Ritchey Rd. and Irene Ln. Deputy arrived on scene and observed a Blue Ford F-150, Tennessee tag BKW8356 in the ditch leaning over on the driver side with a white male identified as Jerry Dean Kile, passed out slumped over in the driver seat with the keys in the ignition. The deputy attempted to open the driver side door to make contact with Jerry and wake him up to see if he was ok. Jerry woke up and stated that he was, "Ok". The deputy asked Jerry if he needed medical, and he stated no. The deputy then advised Jerry to start crawling out of the vehicle from the passenger side at which time he complied. Once he was out of the vehicle, the deputy detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person as he spoke to him. Jerry was very unsteady on his feet as he was on the roadway walking towards his patrol vehicle. The deputy did ask Jerry how much alcohol he had to drink and he stated, "a lot". The deputy ask him if he would do Tennessee Standardized Field Sobriety Test and he said, "No." Corporal Hawkins made contact with the victim/complainant, she stated a Blue Ford F-150 started to follow her from Highway 72 and Wade Road. The vehicle followed her when she turned onto Highway 444 and then into the parking lot of "The Neighborhood". It continued to follow her from there back to 444. When she arrived at the intersection of Highway 444 and Amohi Way, the vehicle accelerated and rear ended the victim silver Volvo. The vehicle then sped off from the scene. The victim advised that she wanted to press charges. Corporal Hawkins arrived on scene and advised him his Miranda warning at which time he stated he understood. Corporal Hawkins asked Jerry if he intentionally struck the victim with his vehicle at which time he denied that he had struck any vehicles. The damage on the Silver Volvo was on the rear bumper, right side. The deputy did observe damage to the front bumper of the F-150 on the right left side. Base on my observations of Jerry, The deputy placed him in custody, advised him he was under arrest for DUI, and read him the Implied Consent where he did agree to a blood test. Carlos Escobar, 23, Williams Road Knoxville, was charged with Reckless Endangerment, and Reckless Driv-

Tony Branson Deputy LCSO, did observe two vehicles traveling south on Broadway (Hwy 11) before D Street at a very high rate of speed and weaving recklessly between cars and cutting them off. Deputy activated his emergency lights and sirens on his marked patrol unit and attempted to catch up to the two vehicles. The deputy caught up to the vehicles, a red Camaro followed by a red Corvette, as both vehicles turned right on Browder Hollow Rd. The driver of the red Corvette, Carlos Ramirez Escobar (offender), slowed and motioned for

the deputy to go around. The deputy did pass the Corvette and got behind the Camaro (driven by Marco Guzman Espinoza, offender), but slowed to prevent the Corvette from fleeing, and the Camaro driver activated his hazard lights before coming to a stop in front of Browder Hollow Rd. Upon making contact with both drivers, it was discovered that there was an adult female, (victim), and a baby, (victim), in the Camaro, and a juvenile male, (victim), in the Corvette. Deputies Justin Parks and Moe Jackson arrived on the scene, and all vehicles were moved to the parking lot of the Old Time Gospel Church (1962) Browder Hollow Rd., Lenoir City) for everyone's safety. Carlos Escobar and Marco Espinoza were taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Detention Facility without incident. Escobar was charged with one count each of TCA 55-10-205 Reckless Driving and TCA 39-13-103 Reckless Endangerment. Espinoza was charged with one count of TCA 55-10-205 Reckless Driving and two counts of TCA 39-13-103 Reckless Endangerment. Deputy Moe Jackson remained on the scene with the passengers until the passengers and vehicles were released to responsible 3rd parties. All of the above did occur in Loudon County, TN.
