

Henry did not have an active warrant. The deputy then took Henry into custody, and Deputy Willis transported her to the




#### Free Clinic

The General Assembly recently passed legislation designating June 6 as a day of special observance for D-Day. Gov. Bill Lee signed the bill into law in late March.


