Gibson County Sheriff Profited from Inmate Labor

Sheriff Paul Thomas Indicted on Multiple Counts

A new investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Gibson County Sheriff Paul Thomas, who has served as Sheriff since 2014.

The investigation outlines a scheme employed by Thomas to enrich himself and a group of investors by profiting from the labor and care of Gibson County and

Tennessee Department of Correction inmates.

In 2020, Thomas and a group of local investors created three for-profit businesses known collectively as the Alliance Group. These businesses provided staffing assistance to local businesses, housed current and former inmates at a transitional home called Orchard House, and provided transportation to work release

inmates and former inmates traveling to and from work.

Investigators determined that Thomas directed \$1,417,204.06 in inmate wage fees and deductions to profit the Alliance Group from February 2020 through October 2022. At least 170 inmates in Thomas' custody were employed by the Alli-



Timothy Hassett, 32, West Broadway Street Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and License Required.

Officer Wilkes LCPD, was dispatched to a reckless driver coming into Lenoir City on Hwy 11. The CP stated that the vehicle in question was a gray Dodge Caravan, and provided a partial tag of 'BPM'. The CP stated that the vehicle was traveling at a high rate of speed and was all over the roadway. Officer Wilkes located

that vehicle on Hwy 11 crossing Hwy 321. Once behind the vehicle, the officer confirmed the tag to be 'BPM4371', and conducted a traffic stop at the Beer Cave. Upon approaching the driver, identified as Timothy Hassett, the officer detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage omitting from his person, and observed him to have bloodshot and glossy eyes, along with slurred speech. Mr. Hassett advised me that he consumed one alcoholic beverage earlier in the day, then changing his answer to five alcoholic beverages, and then to two

alcoholic beverages. The officer asked Mr. Hassett to exit his vehicle, where the officer observed him to be unsteady on his feet, having to use his vehicle for balance. Mr. Hassett was asked to perform SFST's, to which he consented. During HGN, I observed lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation, and onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both eyes. During the instructional phase of walk and turn, Mr. Hassett was unable to maintain his balance. While explaining the walk and turn, Mr. Hassett stated that he wasn't going to perform the task, and attempted to walk back to his vehicle. The officer then placed Mr. Hassett into my custody for DUI. After running

Mr. Hassett's drivers license, dispatch stated that his license had an expired status. Mr. Hassett was read the TN Implied Consent Form, to which he refused. During a consensual search of the vehicle, Ofc. J. Robinson located two empty cans of 12OZ Voodoo Ranger, one empty 16OZ Voodoo Ranger, one empty 16OZ Twisted Tea can, and a bottle of Tito's. Mr. Hassett's vehicle was locked and left secure in a parking spot at the Beer Cave. Mr. Hassett was then transported to jail.

Candice Phillips, 42, Calloway Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession, and Criminal Trespass.

According to the report, Cpl. J. Sartin LCSO, was dispatched to Calloway Drive in reference to a trespasser. Upon arrival the deputy made contact with Ms. Candice Phillips who is criminally trespassed from this residence.

After confirming with dispatch, the deputy took Ms. Phillips into custody. While in my vehicle I explained to Ms. Phillips that if she had anything on her it would be a felony at the jail. She then said she had something in her bra, but it wasn't real. Ms. Phillips handed me a small brown

baggie with what appeared to be heroin in it.

The report noted, After taking Ms. Phillips to the jail, I had Inv. C. Green test the substance with the TruNarc and it tested positive for heroin. The weight of the heroin was 1.2 grams.

Whitney Hamilton, 27, Bailey Road Kingston, was charged with DUI.

Deputy Allen LCSO, conducted a traffic stop on a silver Toyota Camry on Old Hickory Lane at Highway 70. The vehicle was traveling at 61 miles per hour in a 45-mile-per-hour zone.

Upon observing the vehicle, the deputy noticed the driver was failing to maintain their lane, crossing the yellow lines multiple times. When the depu-

ty approached the driver's window, the deputy identified the driver as Whitney Hamilton. Ms. Hamilton had a strong odor of alcoholic beverages on her breath and was chewing gum in an attempt to conceal the odor.

The report noted, The deputy asked Ms. Hamilton to exit the vehicle, and she denied consuming alcoholic beverages. However, she agreed to perform standardized field sobriety tests, on which she performed poorly. While being taken into custody,

Ms. Hamilton admitted to having consumed alcohol. After reading the implied consent form, Ms. Hamilton agreed to provide a sample of her blood. She was then transported to Fort Loudoun Medical

Center for a blood draw. Following the blood draw, Ms. Hamilton was transported to the Loudon County jail without incident. This incident occurred in Loudon County, TN.





ance staffing agency during the investigation. Alliance Transportation was paid \$18 per day to transport these inmates to and from work. Additionally, 82 inmates were allowed to reside at Orchard House instead of the Gibson County jail without proper approval and were charged \$40 per day by Orchard House.

Thomas, who held a 20% ownership interest in Alliance, was prohibited by state law from profiting or benefiting from the labor of inmates. He received \$181,644.50 in compensation, payroll benefits, and legal representation services from Alliance. This money was derived from inmate labor.

Thomas also deceived the Tennessee Department of Correction (TDOC) by allowing 74 state inmates held in the Gibson County jail

to reside at Orchard House without proper approval by a judge. Thomas continued to show the jail as the inmate location in the state's offender management system which resulted in the county collecting \$507,273 in reimbursements from TDOC. Thomas then required the county to disburse these funds to Orchard House without TDOC's knowledge or consent. Orchard House was neither attached to the jail nor staffed by jail personnel, and no contract existed between the county and Orchard House.

Furthermore, Thomas improperly handled the wages earned by inmates working for Alliance. Instead of having their wages deposited into an inmate trust account (also known as a commissary account) to benefit each individual inmate, Thomas directed \$448,637.09 of inmate wages to be deposited

into a private account owned and controlled by the Alliance Group.

Based upon this investigation, in May 2024, Paul Thomas was indicted by both the Davidson and Gibson County Grand Juries on a combined total of 22 counts. These indictments include counts of theft, forgery, computer crimes, and official misconduct. A full list of charges can be found in the investigative report.

"Our investigators identified multiple deficiencies

within the Sheriff's Office that coincided with this scheme," said Comptroller Mumpower. "We also learned that Sheriff Thomas failed to disclose his ownership interest in Alliance in his annual filings with the Tennessee Ethics Commission and violated his duty to secure and properly guard inmates until they were lawfully discharged."
