# CDC Warns of Salmonella outbreak linked to bearded dragons

A CDC investigation notice regarding a multistate outbreak of Salmonella infections has been posted: https://www. cdc.gov/salmonella/ cotham-06-24/index. html

Key Points:

CDC has received reports of 15 Salmonella illnesses linked to bearded dragons across 9 states. Four people have been hospitalized and no deaths have been reported.

60% of sick people are children under 5 years old. Bearded dragons are not recommended as pets for children younger than 5, adults aged 65 or older, and people with weakened immune systems because these people are more likely to get a serious illness from germs that reptiles carry.

Bearded

dragons

can carry Salmonella germs in their droppings even if they look healthy and clean.

You can get sick from touching your bearded dragon or anything in its environment and then touching your mouth or food and swallowing Salmonella



Officer Miller Lenoir City Police Department responded to Broadway (Ez Stop) in Lenoir City, TN in regards to a theft that occurred at the gas station back on May 25th, 2024. On scene the officer made contact with the victim, the complainant who is a manager at the above establishment. The complainant reported that she had a small statue belonging to her that was kept on the counter area near the kitchen of the establishment. On May 26th, 2024, the complainant came into work and noticed that the statue belonging to her was missing at which time she reviewed the cameras inside of the gas station and located a male subject responsible for stealing the statue.

On May 25th, 2024, at approximately 14:09hrs. an unknown white male subject wearing a white shirt, black cargo shorts and black hat is seen entering the front doors of the gas station. 




