Deputy Parks LCSO, observed a maroon Chevrolet Blazer on Highway 321 with no lights illuminating the registration. The deputy initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle on Highway 321 at the intersection of Interstate 40. The deputy approached the vehicle and made contact with the driver, Mr. Joseph

Goins, and the passenger, Ms. Olivia Russell, and informed them of the reason for stop. While speaking with the two, vehicle and performed a Ms. Russell exhibited a lot of movement, concealing her hands under her legs multiple times as if she were trying to conceal something. I gathered Mr. Goins drivers license and Ms. Russell declined to give any type of identifying information. I returned to my patrol vehicle and advised dispatch to conduct a warrant check on Mr. Goins. Sgt. Pesterfield arrived on scene, and the deputy updated him on the situation. While doing so, Sgt. Pesterfield noticed Ms. Russell making furtive move-

ments toward the floorboard of the vehicle. The deputy asked Mr. Goins to exit the consent pat down for weapons. While speaking with Mr. Goins, dispatch advised he had an active arrest warrant for VOP out of Loudon County. I placed Mr. Goins under arrest and returned to the vehicle to inform Ms. Russell of the situation. The deputy told Ms. Russell if she had a valid license the deputy would let her drive the vehicle from the scene so the two would not have to pay for a tow. Ms. Russell refused to provide any identifving information so the deputy asked her to exit the vehicle so he could inventory it for tow. Upon being asked to exit the vehicle, Ms. Russell got her purse from the floorboard of the vehicle and clenched it very tightly

close to her body. While performing a inventory of the vehicle the deputy found a glass pipe commonly used for narcotics located in the back floorboard within arms reach of both occupants. The deputy seized the pipe and then searched Ms. Russell's purse. The deputy found a baggie containing a white crystal substance believed to be methamphetamine (0.5 grams), as well as a needle. The needle was placed into a sharps container and the pipe and baggie were bagged. Ms. Russell then identified herself and was placed under arrest. The vehicle was towed from the scene by Malones, and both subjects were transported to the jail without incident.

The pipe and baggie were placed into evidence. All of the above occurred in Loudon County, Tennessee.



The "switch" enabled the pistol to fire "fully automatic," that is, fire multiple rounds by a single pull of the trigger. Possession of a "switch" is illegal under Federal law, as the National Firearms Act classifies the "switch" itself as a machine

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee and Special Agent in Charge Marcus Watson of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the ATF Chattanooga Field Office, the ATF Firearms Technology Branch, and the Chattanooga Police Department.

Assistant United States Attorney Kevin T. Brown represented the United States.

This case is part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a program bringing together all levels of law enforcement and the communities they serve to reduce violent crime and gun violence, and to make our neighborhoods safer for everyone. On May 26, 2021, the department launched a violent crime reduction strategy strengthening PSN based on these core principles: fostering trust and legitimacy in our communities, supporting community-based organizations that help prevent violence from occurring in the first place, setting focused and strategic enforcement priorities, and measuring the results.








