Marataya Chandler, 27, Hanley Hollow Clinton, was charged with Assisting other Agency.

Cpl. J. Sartin LCSO, was travelling south on I-75 when the deputy observed a black Ford F-150 Texas plate TFM-7451 driving over the shoulder line. The deputy got behind the truck and observed it come back into its lane and cross over the shoulder again multiple times. The deputy initiated a traffic stop just before the

76-mile marker southbound I-75. Upon approach the deputy made contact with Mr. Jonah Hensley(driver) and Ms. Martaya Chandler. After speaking with them he ran their names with dispatch and asked Mr. Hensley to step out so the deputy could check him for any signs of impairment. After doing so, dispatch confirmed both individuals had active warrants out of Anderson County, and both were placed under arrest. While in my vehicle, I mirandized Ms. Chandler and asked if there was anything illegal in the truck. Ms. Chandler stated she had "rigs" which are syringes. She was asked what she used them for and stated she uses meth. The

deputy had Deputy Wilis mirandize Mr. Hensley who stated he had pipes and meth in a backpack in the vehicle. A search of the vehicle found syringes and tourniquets in a zip up bag under the passenger seat. Behind the driver's seat was a backpack which

the deputy found 1 homemade pill bottle pipe, a glass pipe and a black box containing a baggie with suspected methamphetamine in it. Field weight for the meth was 2.8 grams.

This did occur in Loudon County, TN.





Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department initiated a traffic stop on a green Toyota sedan after identifying the driver to be Jessika Wilson, who the officer knew from prior knowledge had a revoked Tennessee License. A traffic stop on the green Toyota was then initiated in the area of Highway 321 near Interstate 40. Upon the traffic stop the officer made contact with the driver Jessika Wilson and passenger. During the roadside investigation dispatch advised



that WILSON had several revocations on her license history. While writing a citation the officer spoke with the passenger who stated that there was a used hypodermic needle inside of the vehicle under the passenger's seat that was left by someone else. During the conversation the passenger also gave verbal consent to search the vehicle. During the subsequent search of the vehicle, the officer located a contact lens holder that contained used wet cotton inside of it located in the center dash of the vehicle. The cotton located inside of the contact lens holder is commonly used in hand with hypodermic needles for IV drug use. The officer also located the top to a torn "dime bag" (small bag which is commonly used for packaging narcotics) in the passenger's side floorboard. Further into the search the officer located a black purse in the passenger's side floorboard of the vehicle which was later identified to

be WILSON'S through verbal clarification. Inside of the purse was a smaller green bag that contained several hypodermic needles along with a small clear bag that contained a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphet-

amine. The weight of the crystal-likes substance believed to be methamphetamine including the bag it was contained in was approximately (0.32 grams). WILSON claimed that the green bag did belong to her.
