Rebecca Faulks, 31, Oak Street Georgia, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II, and Simple Possession.


Officer T. LaForce LCPD. was on routine patrol in Lenoir City, TN. Officer LaForce observed a black Chevy Malibu traveling south on Hwy 321 at 51 mph in a posted 40 mph zone. The vehicle was exceeding the speed limit by 11 mph. Officer LaForce initiated a traffic stop using my lights and the car pulled over in the roadway on the right side of the road next to a guard rail. Due to the position, LaForce

asked the driver to move to the Ingles Gas Station. Upon approaching the vehicle, La-Force identified the driver a male and the passenger as Rebecca Faulks, based on their respective identifications. Upon making contact with the driver, LaForce immediately detected the odor of burnt marijuana emanating from inside the vehicle. During our interaction, LaForce conducted a search of the car based on the observed odor. This search revealed two baggies of marijuana weighing a total of 7.0 grams, that were found in Ms. Faulks's backpack in the back seat along with 1 single baggie of a white powdery sub-

stance in the door handle of the front passenger seat. Ms. Faulk stated that the narcotics found in the vehicle belonged to her and stated she had 2 more baggies stuffed in her pants, of the white powdery substance, which she stated was cocaine. Ms. Faulks was placed under arrest and trans-

ported to the Loudon County Jail. After arriving on the scene, the corrections deputies retrieved the 2 baggies of cocaine from her person, totaling 3 baggies of cocaine weighing 2.0 grams.

Officer Wilkes LCPD, responded to the Inn of Lenoir in reference to a fight in progress, central dispatch advised that a group of people were in a physical altercation in the parking lot. Upon arrival, Officer Wilkes observed a group of people standing next to a vehicle in the parking lot, and a large group of people on the balcony of the motel, all shouting at each other, and officer. During investigation, Officer Wilkes separated two parties deemed to be the alleged aggressors of the incident. Contact was made with Emily Edwards and Jarryn Johnson, who both had a strong odor of an alcoholic

beverage omitting from their person, slurred speech, and the inability to balance without using an object to hold themselves up. Both parties additionally admitted to consuming alcohol previous to officer arrival as well. Due to both parties being erratic with their movements, consistently shouting, and being uncooperative with officers, they were detained for officer safety. Ms. Edwards stated that Mr. Johnson was upset with her because he thought that she threw her phone out the window of Mr. Johnson's pickup truck. Ms. Edwards stated that after the accusation was made, they began screaming at each other, but at no point did the altercation become physical. Mr. Johnson's story matched Ms. Edwards, additionally advising that the altercation never became physical. Contact was made with the complainant, who stated that he observed the male hit

the female in the face, the female throw a shoe at the male, and the male punching the female once again. Officers examined Mr. Johnson and Ms. Edwards, but no signs of a physical altercation were observed. During the investigation, no primary aggressor

could be determined pertaining a physical domestic. Due to Mr. Johnson and Ms. Edwards being intoxicated in a public place and causing a disturbance, they were placed into officer custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident.



Since Sagamore Hill National Historic Site and the Theodore Roosevelt Inaugural National Historic Site fall under the jurisdiction of the National Park Service (NPS), they reached out to NPS to recover the stolen artifact. NPS, the lead investigative agency, contacted the FBI Art Crime team for additional assistance. Both the NPS and FBI confirmed that this was the watch stolen almost 40 years earlier.

"This watch was a fairly pedestrian Waltham 17 jewel watch with an inexpensive coin silver case. It's a 'Riverside' grade and model '1888' with a hunter-style case, meaning it has a lid on either side which fold and encase the dial and the movement,' said Special Agent Robert Giczy, a member of the FBI Art Crime Team who investigated the provenance of the

watch in this case.

"The repatriation of the watch would not have been possible without the close collaboration between the FBI and NPS. This partnership ensured that this historic treasure could be returned safely for future generations to enjoy."

Roosevelt had many pocket watches during his life, but this one is unique due to its sentimental value. Roosevelt received this watch from his youngest sister, Corinne Roosevelt Robinson, and his brother-in-law, Douglas Robinson, Jr., prior to Roosevelt's departure to Cuba during the Spanish-American War. The inscription, which includes Corinne and Douglas' initials, reads: "THEODORE ROOSEVELT FROM D.R. & C.R.R.

After NPS recovered the watch, they coordinated with the FBI to navigate the asset forfeiture process. As Paralegal Specialist Kellie Dodd from the FBI Tampa Field and Tampa field offices and Office explained, this "al- members of the Art Crime lowed the FBI to begin the process to return the watch back to the rightful owner, the Sagamore Hills National Historic Site.


