

Upperman High School Fishing Booster Club Treasurer Stole \$14,806 School is located in Baxter, TN in Putnam County

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Rosemary Downs, the former treasurer of the Upperman High School Fishing Booster Club in Baxter, TN. The booster club supports the school's fishing team and is led by parents and other vol-

Investigators determined that Downs

misappropriated club bank and withdrew funds totaling at least \$14,806.82 from November 2022 through debit card to withdraw March 2024. As treasurer, Downs had direct ATM machines. access to the booster club's checking ac-

count and debit card. Down's stole money from the club for her own personal use using the following four schemes:

She completed and signed 15 checking withdrawal slips at the

cash totaling \$11,215.

She used the club's \$798 in cash from

She wrote eight unauthorized checks payable to her husband totaling \$2,393.82 and subsequently endorsed the checks by signing her husband's name on the back without his

Carolyn DeLorenzo, 43, Jackson Bend Road Lenoir City, was charged with Disorderly Conduct, Public Intoxication, and Resisting Arrest.

Deputy Billy Freeman LCSO, responded to Jackson Bend Road for a physical domestic. Upon arrival, the deputy spoke to the complainant, who said that her son's Fiancée, later identified as Carolyn DeLorenzo, was screaming, throwing things, and busted the glass of the car, the son statement was the same as his mother's. The deputy then spoke to Carolyn who stated they were arguing over him being a "momma's boy". She then said that he pushed her and that she threw a salt shaker at his head. Carolyn then said that they ended up outside where she threw a rock or a brick, busting the glass of her car. No primary aggressor could be

determined for the domestic. The vehicle was found to be registered to Carolyn and the victim. Carolyn admitted to drinking and had an odor of an alcoholic beverage. While Sgt. Pesterfield was talking to her, Carolyn became irate and started velling and cursing. She was then advised she had one more opportunity to call a ride. While on the phone with her father, she became irate again screaming to the point the neighbors across the street had come outside. She then started to walk away. Deputy Kirkland then told her to stop and tried to place her arms behind her back where she continued resisting. As the deputy was trying to secure handcuffs on her wrists, she tried to pull her arm away again. Carolyn was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail. 

Kaydin Townson, 24, Out-er Drive Lenoir City, was charged with, Simple Possession, Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence, and Violation of Probation.

Deputy Billy Freeman LCSO, was traveling west on Hwy 72, when he observed a silver Kia sedan traveling east on same, without its headlights on. The deputy conducted a traffic stop, stopping on Hwy 72 at Von-ore Road. After making contact with the driver, Ms. Kaydin Townson, the deputy did

The deputy was advised by Loudon County Dispatch, that the jail did have an active warrant for Violation of Probation (Docket # 23-CR-261) in hand. After verifying by DOB that it was her, the deputy had Ms. Townson step in front of his vehicle, and placed her under arrest. The deputy then asked if she had anything illegal on her, to which she replied "No". The deputy placed Ms. Townson in the back seat of his patrol car for her safety. While conducting a search of the vehicle, Deputy E. Owens did notice Ms. Townson smell the odor of marijuana. making furtive movements

in the back of the car and looked like she was chewing on something. We then checked on her, to find she had slipped her left wrist out of his handcuff and had crushed marijuana leaves on her leg and in the floor, and 2 blue pressed pills believed to be fentanyl, along with a partial 3rd wrapped up in tin foil, under the back seat of my patrol car.

There were also remnants

of crushed blue pills in the floor board of the back seat. Ms. Townson also had remains of crushed marijuana in her mouth. Ms. Townson was then cleared by Priority Ambulance Services due to the possibility of ingesting fentanyl.

The deputy then transported Ms. Townson to the Loudon County Jail. This did occur in Loudon County,

Tennessee.

She used the club's debit card to make two Carnival Cruise transactions totaling \$400. "Booster club thefts continue to be an area of contern across Tennessee," said

Downs admitted to investigators that she used club funds for personal use. She also made personal deposits to the club totaling \$6,025 that she claimed were used to reimburse the club.

Based upon this investigation, in July 2024, the Putnam County Grand Jury indicted Rosemary Downs on one count of theft of property

over \$10,000 and one count of forgery.

"Booster club thefts continue to be an area of concern across Tennessee," said Comptroller Mumpower. "As in many other cases, this situation involved one person who was given too much control over all financial duties without others being involved. A basic level of oversight would include requiring two signatures on all checks."






