Deputy Harrison was dispatched to Lake Forest Drive in reference to vandalism and theft. Once on scene, the deputy spoke with the complainant /victim, who stated a couple Christina Stone and a male had been recently evicted from the property and had destroyed and sto-While walking around the back side of the property, the deputy observed grey tubing used to house copper wiring scattered around the rear of





Ethan Duke, 25, Ford Road Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Criminal Trespass, and Public Intoxication.

Deputy Brockwell LCSO, arrived at Ford Road for a wreck with no injury. The deputy spoke with the who wants to remain anonymous, and he stated that a car pulled into their driveway with front-end damage. The car was a 2015 GMC Acadia (TN registration #

250BLNC). Deputy Jackson and Brockwell responded to a reckless driver call on July 16, 2024, at approximately 2249 where we could not locate the vehicle. The complainant at the time described the vehicle as a GMC Acadia and provided the same registration as the one found on the scene. The family of the homeowner/complainant, offender, Ethan Duke, arrived on the scene. Deputy Jackson and Brockwell spoke with the family members, and they stated that no one has heard from Duke since July 16, 2024, at approximately

1930. His dad stated that at that time Duke was on the way to a comedy club to tell some jokes. His mom stated that they saw his location on Life 360 and came to the location it showed him. The last location Life 360 gave was at the above address on Ford Road on July 16, 2024, at approximately 2250. The brother stated that Duke always drinks when he goes to the comedy club and that he has been dealing with stress since his wife was about to have their second child any day. Duke's mother looked inside of the vehicle and located his phone and other personal belongings.

We gathered more information to start a missing person report and searched the area for Duke. Cpl. Wallen arrived on the scene and contacted EMA 5 for a drone so we could search the area further. While searching for an extended period, we observed a male walking down Ford Road and identified him as the missing person, Ethan Duke. While speaking with Duke, there was a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person. Duke was then detained for further investigation. Another individual, arrived on the scene and asked if we were looking for someone. He then stated that he woke up for work and found an unknown male sleeping on his couch who was not supposed to be there (later determined to be Duke). Duke told him that he was at a comedy club and had been drinking. The male told him to leave the residence and that is when we contacted Duke. Duke was then taken into custody for public intoxication and aggravated criminal trespassing. Duke was transported the the Loudon County Detention Facility. This did happen in Loudon County, TN without further incident.






