



Chastity Williams, Wayne Avenue Ohio, was charged with Burglary, Theft of Property, and Driving on Revoked/Suspended License.

Willie Williams, 19, Auntria Street Ohio, was charged with Theft of Property, and Burglary.

Kalique Jeter-Lipscoms, 18, Kents Street Ohio, was charged with Theft of Property, and Burglary.

Lenoir City Police Department Officers responded to a report of a theft that had just occurred at the Walmart located at Hwy 321 N. in Lenoir City. Upon arrival, officers detained three occupants at Abbie Dr. and Hwy 321, occupying a dark colored, Dodge van (OH plate EPC5212) matching the description of the vehicle the suspects left in. Walmart loss prevention staff reported the three individuals, Chastity Alyse Kay Williams, Willie Devry Edwin Williams, and Kalique Latife Jeter-Lipscoms, forced the jewelry display open and stole several pieces of jewelry valued at over \$3000.00. The

three suspects made it past all points of sale, made no attempt to pay and fled from loss prevention staff when confronted at the door. It was later discovered the three suspects also stole boys' underwear, two children's T-shirts, insect bite medication, Tylenol and a radar detector. All three subjects violated TCA §§ 39-14-103. Theft of Property, by entering Walmart to permanently deprive them of their property. He did not observe anyone else helping the couple move on this date. The new address the two are believed to be living at is Creswell Drive, Knoxville, TN.

The victim does wish to prosecute.



Course, which has become a crowd favorite and adds to the excitement of the day. In collaboration with Lenoir City Parks and Rec, there will also be a toucha-truck event.




Jorge Zamora, 33, Highway 72 Loudon, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Resisting Arrest, and Contraband in Penal Institution.

Officer Luna LPD, observed a vehicle traveling under the speed limit and unable to maintain lane, going over the double yellow line several times. Officer attempted a traffic stop in the area of Hwy 72 and Bethany Baptist Church, vehicle decrease their speed but fail to stop. Vehicle came to stop moments later, vehicle stop in the road and partially in the shoulder, driver stepped out of the vehicle and was asked to step back in the vehicle and pull over in the shoulder. Vehicle struggle to do so. Upon approach to the vehicle officer observed the

driver had bloodshot eyes and was profusely sweating. Mr. Zamora was told to turn around and placed his hands behind his back which Mr. Zamora turn around and told the officer to let him go home. Mr. Zamora kept pulling his arms away from the officer and kept tensing up. Officer Clemmer and Officer Luna brought Mr. Zamora to the ground in the process to secure him,

Mr. Zamora kept refusing to comply with officers commands, Officers warn if he did not comply force (Taser) was going to be used, Mr. Zamora comply and officer were able to placed him under arrest. Once Mr. Zamora was placed on the back of the officer police car he was read the Tennessee Implied consent, witch he was asked to answer multiple times and Mr. Zamora stated over and over to take him home or

let him go. Implied consent was noted as a refusal. He was later transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. Loudon County Jail minutes later contact Officer Luna regarding a white powder substance found inside a pack of cigarette on Mr. Zamora person, He was later Charge with Introduction Controlled Substance into Penal Institution. All of the above occurred in the City of Loudon TN.




