TELLICO VILLAGE PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION AGREES TO PAY \$1.3M FOLLOWING IMPROPER RECEIPT OF PPP LOAN

Tellico Village Property Owners Association, Inc. (TVPOA) has agreed to pay \$1,361,992.22 to resolve allegations that it violated the False Claims Act by applying for, receiving, and obtaining forgiveness of a loan under the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) for which it was not eligible.

Congress created the PPP in March

2020, as part of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, to provide relief to small businesses experiencing economic hardship during the COVID-19 pandemic. Although certain nonprofit organizations were eligible to receive PPP Loans at various times throughout the program, 501(c)(4) nonprofit organizations have never been eligible.

In April 2020, TVPOA, a 501(c)(4) nonprofit organization, applied for and received a PPP loan. The PPP application required applicants to identify their business type from a list of eligible options or, alternatively, to select "Other." The application also required applicants to certify that



Cody Davis, 31, County Road 360 Athens, was charged with Aggravated Assault, Resisting Arrest, Vandalism, and Kidnapping.

Deputy Owens LCSO, was in the area of highway 321 and Highland Park Drive and while in the area Deputy Owens observed a White Lexus stopped at the red light to his right with a woman in the driver seat looking his direction and mouthing "help". As Deputy Owens was placing his patrol vehicle in park he observed the back door on the driver side open up and in the backseat there was a white female who appeared to be upset and hysterical. At that time Deputy Owens observed a male exit the vehicle from the

back door on the passenger side and he proceeded to flee from the scene. While the male was fleeing announcements were made and the male was commanded to stop. The male did not stop he continued to flee and run down Highland Park Dr. Deputy Owens continued to give chase behind the male still ordering him to stop, which he did not. Deputy Owens then pulled out his taser and advised that he would use the taser if he did not stop. The male still did not stop at that point and Owens continued to give chase. Owens was able to catch up to the male and he ordered him to get down on the ground at taser point which he did and he was detained on Pinewood Dr. After the male was detained he was placed in the back of my patrol vehicle and

Owens then returned to Taco Bell where the victims were waiting by to conduct his investigation. Contact was made with the victims, which both advised that the male who was identified as Cody Davis had been extremely violent and abusive to them throughout the night. Victim 1, who is Cody's mother advised that Cody had moved to Reno, NV not to long ago but had returned home to visit. She advised that she did not know victim 2 who had returned from Reno with Davis. Victim 1 advised that she was called to pick up Davis and victim 2 from a friends house in McMinn county where they had been drinking and riding on a boat. Victim 1 stated that while driving down the road Davis was in the front seat, and at some point he became irate and he began to yell and scream at the two victims inside the vehicle. Victim 1 advised she did not know what was said but stated that at one point Davis jumped from the front seat and into the backseat with victim 2 and that is when he began to assault her. Victim 1 stated that it got to the point to where she stopped the vehicle on the roadway and at that time victim 2 had exited the vehicle and started to walk away. At that time Davis proceeded to bear hug victim 2 and had her pinned up against the vehicle. Victim 1 told Davis that she was going to call 911 and at that point Davis took her phone as well as Victim 2 phone so that they would

be unable to contact anyone for help. Victim 1 stated that she was attempting to get in between the two, and when she tried to break them up she was shoved and told to stay out of it. Victim 2 was then forced back into the vehicle by Davis. Victim 1 advised that she was ordered by Davis to keep driving her vehicle and he also threatened her and told her not to drive to her household and to drive to Lenoir City. Victim 1 continued driving and while she was driving she explained that she witnessed Davis continue to hit and grab victim 2. Victim 1 stated that when she approached the 75NB/81 exit victim 2 attempted to jump out of the vehicle again which she was stopped again by Davis from exiting the vehicle. Victim 1 explained that victim 2 was begging her to help and she advised that she continued to assure her that she would help her. Victim 1 explained that she felt like herself and victim 2 were hostages in her vehicle. While speaking with victim 2 she did explain that she was hit, grabbed, and strangled by Davis during the course of the drive. Victim 1 did have visible wounds from Davis pushing and even biting her. Victim 2 did have visible wounds as well on her right forearm and along her neck. Victim 1 passenger side door handle was damaged by Davis as well. Davis was placed under arrest without further incident. All of the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.





Lindsay Barton, 38, Maple Hill Road Loudon, was charged with Driving Under the Influence.

Officer Parmer LCPD, was dispatched to CVS, Hwy 321 N, in regard to a 911 hang-up. Lt. Dragon arrived on scene, and made contact with the caller. While speaking with the complainant, she advised that she was calling because her boyfriend's mom was driving while intoxicated. The complainant advised that she was driving a black Ford Expedition, and while in the immediate vicinity of CVS, Officer Palmer observed a black Ford Expedition, bearing TN tag 613BJCX, traveling northbound on Hwy 321 N. While behind the vehicle, he observed it run the stop sign at Highland Park Drive and Simpson Rd West. A traffic stop was conducted on the vehicle as it pulled into

the CVS parking lot, and contact was made with the driver, identified as 38-year-old Lindsay Barton. Upon immediate contact with Ms. Barton, Officer Parmer could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the passenger compartment of the vehicle, observed her to have slurred speech, and watery, blood-shot eyes. Officer Parmer requested that Ms. Barton step out of the vehicle and perform SFST's, to which she consented. Mr. Barton performed unsatisfactorily on all tests administered. Officer Sparks conducted ARIDE testing on Ms. Barton, to which she performed unsatisfactorily. Parmer asked Ms. Barton how much alcohol she had consumed, and she ultimately advised that she had taken 3 shots of 99 liquor approximately 30 minutes prior to our contact. When asked how intoxicated

she was, on a scale of 1-10, Ms. Barton stated a 5 or 6. Based on the totality of the circumstances, Ms. Barton was ultimately placed into my custody and read Tennessee Implied Consent, to which she consented to a blood draw for chemi-

cal testing. Ms. Barton was transported to Fort Loudon Medical Center where a blood draw was conducted, then to the Loudon County Jail, without further incident. The above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, Tennessee.





 they were eligible to receive a PPP loan. On the application it submitted, "C-Corp" was selected as TVPOA's entity type. In submitting its application, TVPOA represented that it was eligible to receive the applied-for loan. TVPOA later applied for and received forgiveness of its PPP loan. TVPOA cooperated fully with the United States' investigation and contends that any misstatements in its application were inadvertent. The settlement amount reflects TVPOA's cooperation.

This Settlement resolves a lawsuit filed under the qui tam, or whistleblower, provisions of the False Claims Act, which permits private parties to sue on behalf of the government for false claims and receive a share of any recovery. The qui tam case is captioned United States ex rel. GNGH2, Inc. v. Tellico

Village Property Owners Association, Inc., No. 3:23-cv-199 (E.D. Tenn.).

Assistant U.S. Attorneys Alexa Ortiz Hadley and Ben Cunningham represented the United States, with assistance from the Small Business Administration.

On May 17, 2021, the Attorney General established the COVID-19 Fraud Enforcement Task Force to marshal the resources of the Department of Justice in partnership with agencies across the government to enhance efforts to combat and prevent pandemic-related fraud. The Task Force bolsters efforts to investigate and prosecute the most culpable domestic and international criminal actors and assists agencies tasked with administering relief programs to prevent fraud by, among other methods, augmenting and incorporating existing coordination mechanisms, identifying

Jason Heiden, 50, Quapaw Circle Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy Parks LCSO, responded to the parking lot of the Loudon County Sheriff's Office to speak with two individuals about an assault. On scene, Deputy Parks made contact with the victims, who advised they were afraid to return to their residence due to their son making threats to their life. The two advised on Monday, 06/24/2024, their son, Jason Heiden, was at Quapaw Circle, their residence, watching a baseball game. Throughout the course of the night he became heavily intoxicated and began threatening them. Victim 1 advised her son stated, "He was going to slit their throats." Mr. Heiden had also began asking the two for money in the following days. They advised he was waiting on them in the driveway of their residence currently and they were in fear for their safety. Mr. Heiden had previously threatened to slit their throats in December 2023, and they believed he intended to do it. Victim 2 advised he was very concerned

for their safety even advising, "My wife is scared shitless." Deputies responded Quapaw Circle but Mr. Heiden was gone on arrival. Approximately an hour later, dispatch advised they had received a call from the parents stating their son was back at the residence. Deputy Parks responded to the residence and made contact with Jason Heiden sitting in the living room. Deputy Parks advised him he had a warrant for his arrest and to stand up and put his hands behind his back. Mr. Heiden refused and I placed a handcuff on his left wrist while he was seated. At that point Mr. Heiden told me he was not going to stand up and began to pull away with his left hand. Mr. Heiden refused verbal commands and Deputy Parks deployed his taser, striking Mr. Heiden in the chest. The taser deployment was effective and deputies on scene were able to handcuff Mr. Heiden at that point. Mr. Heiden was then placed into the back of his patrol vehicle and transported to the Loudon County Justice Center without incident. All of the above occurred in Loudon County, Tennessee.
