



Four Charged With Drug Trafficking **And Firearms Offenses**

A federal grand jury in Knoxville, Tennessee, returned an eight-count indictment against four defendants-Mark O'Neil Robinson, 41, of Atlanta, Georgia; Christopher Harold Roberts, 57, of Knoxville, Tennessee; Brian Kirksey, 44, of Tennes-Knoxville, see; and Donnie Lee Oliver, 55, of Powell, Tennessee.

According to the

indictment filed with of 18 U.S.C. § 924(c). the court, all defendants Roberts is also charged are charged with a conspiracy to distribute 50 grams or more of methamphetamine and 40 grams or more of fentanyl, in violation of 21 U.S.C. §§ 846, 841(a) (1), and 841(b)(1)(A). Robinson is also charged with possessing a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime, including a firearm equipped with a silencer, in violation

with possession with the intent to distribute methamphetamine and possessing a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime in violation of 21 U.S.C. §§ 841(a)(1), 841(b) (1)(B), and 18 U.S.C. § 924(c).

Murder

The Loudon County Sheriff's Office is announcing a significant development in the ongoing investigation of the murder of Jacob Bishop, a dedicated member of the Tennessee Army National Guard, who was tragically killed on October 1st, 2019, in Lenoir City.

On August 13th, 2024, Detectives and Deputies from the Loudon County Sheriff's Office arrested Eric Austin Byrd, 39, of Lenoir City, TN, and James Bish-Amanda op, 39, of Kingston, TN, (Spouse of Jacob Bishop), in connection with the murder of Jacob Bishop. The arrests were made after a thorough and comprehensive investigation that involved collaboration with multiple law enforcement agencies including the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, FBI - Federal Bureau of Investigation, FBI - Knoxville, United States Secret Service, US Alcohol Tobacco & Firearms (ATF).

lice Department, Knox-- TN, Sulphur Springs Police Department, Hopkins County Sheriff's Office Texas, Roane County Sheriff's Office, Wilson County Sheriff's Office, TN, Union County Sheriff's Office - Tennessee, 9th Judicial Drug Task Force, 9th District Attorney Generals Office, Russell Johnson - 9th Judicial District, District Attorney General, Knox County Regional Forensic Center and the Regional Organized Crime Information Center (ROCIC).

Jacob Bishop was found deceased at his home in Lenoir City on the morning of October 1st, 2019, by his mother. Jacob suffered from multiple gunshot wounds and was bound by zip-ties. Immediately a homicide investigation began that spanned over the next almost five years.

"Today's arrests mark a crucial step towards justice for Jacob Bishop and

Maryville Police Depart- his family" said Sheriff ment-TN, Lenoir City Po- Jimmy Davis. "This case has remained a top priville Police Department ority for our office, and I commend the relentless efforts of our detectives and partner agencies who have worked tirelessly to bring those responsible to justice."

Jacob Bishop was a dedicated member of the Tennessee Army National Guard and beloved family member. Their loss has been deeply felt by the community. The investigation faced numerous challenges, but advancements in technology and new evidence allowed the case to progress.

The suspects are currently being held at the Loudon County Detention Center and are facing charges including 1st Degree Murder and both have bonds set at \$1,000,000. The 9th District Attorney's Office will be handling the prosecution of this case.

Hall

Earlier this morning Lenoir City Police Department recieved a call of a suspicious male at the Aldi on Highway 321 and Highland Park Drive. While dispatchers were gathering information from the initial caller, they began receiving multiple calls about the same male running down Highland Park Drive. Witnesses stated that they heard gunshots and screaming coming from the area where the male was last seen.

Within minutes of the initial call, deputies and officers from the Loudon County Sheriff's Office, Lenoir City Police Department, Tennessee Highway Patrol, Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), and Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms (ATF) arrived on scene. A perimeter was quickly established and LCSO detectives deployed a drone and

began canvasing the area.

After a preliminary investigation into the incidents that occurred, the male was identified as Caiden Hall. Hall and his girlfriend got into a verbal argument. The argument escalated and Hall ran a short distance to his home and retrieved a pistol from within the home. Hall came back outside and began firing into the air and took off running into the woods. As a precaution, and due to the close proximity, Highland Park Elementary was placed on lockdown.

A short time later Hall was seen coming out of the woods by LCSO detectives that were utilizing a drone. Deputies and Officers were able to safety take Hall into custody.

Troopers from the Tennessee Highway Patrol deployed a Explosives Ordinance Detection (EOD) K-9 and located the firearm that was hidden in

the woods. The firearm was recovered by LCSO detectives.

"Thanks to the swift and coordinated efforts of multiple
agencies, we were able to safely take this suspect into custody" said Sheriff Jimmy Davis.
"The situation was handled
with the utmost care to ensure
the safety of the community,
especially nearby resident's
and the students and staff at
Highland Park Elementary
School. We are grateful for the
cooperation of everyone involved in bringing this incident
to a peaceful resolution."

Caiden Hall was charged with Reckless Endangerement and transported to the Loudon County Detention Facility.



smoked 80% of it. He then proceeded to tell the deputy that he could keep the meth. The possible meth was placed into evidence.






