

Matthew Underwood, 32. Stone Gate Circle Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Kidnapping, Aggravated Assault, Domestic arrival, the deputies made Assault, and DUI.

Deputy Frye and Deputy Curtis LCSO, responded to Steekee Elementary School to assist CPL Sartin. Upon

contact with Matthew Underwood who had glossy, bloodshot eyes and kept fidgeting. Underwood 2021 Ford was driving Explorer, tag BNW-5776 from 72 Market and Deli onto Steekee School where CPL Sartin made the traffic

Due to his behavior, the deputy asked Underwood to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests in which he complied. Deputy Curtis asked Underwood to perform ARIDE tests in which he complied. Based

upon his performance with both tests, Deputy Curtis and Sartin believed that Underwood was impaired, and had been driving impaired. Deputy Frye read Underwood Implied Consent in which he agreed.

Deputy Frye then transported him to Fort Loudoun Medical Center for a blood draw. Deputy Frve then transported him to the Loudon County Detention Center and charged him with Driving Under the Influence (TCA 55-10-401). This incident did occur in Loudon County, TN.

Officer Kelley LPD, was dispatched to assist the county at Steekee School Road for a domestic assault that occurred in the city limits. Upon arrival Officer made contact with Deputy Jon Sartin which stated that the victim and Matthew Underwood had been involved in a domestic assault that occurred in Loudon. The victim wrote out a statement stating that Matthew Underwood was mad at the victim over another guy calling her phone. The victim stated that Matt Underwood stated he was going to kill himself in front of her. The victim tried to escape by running out the door, Matt closed the door on the victim and drug her through the hallway in a head-

lock. The victim calmed Matt down and he got mad again and got the victim in another headlock choking her and saying "Go to sleep, Go to sleep". The victim stated she was in fear of her life and could not breath at all.

The victim stated she screamed and was able to get him to leave the house by getting in victims car with Matthew Underwood driving her vehicle. Matthew Underwood was taken into custody by Loudon County Sheriffs Department on separate charges. Matthew Underwood was charged with Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Kidnapping and Domestic assault by Loudon Police Department. The said actions above occurred in Loudon County TN 37774.

### Charged

Richard Shepherd, 40, Oakland Avenue Lenoir City, was charged with, Aggravated Criminal Trespassing, Vandalism, and Public Intoxication.

Deputy Miller along with Deputies Stanley, Harrison, and Huskin LCSO, responded to reports of an individual trying to get into an occupied home. Upon arriving, Deputy Huskin had already made contact with Richard Shepherd who was trying to get into the residence of the victim. Richard had been detained and placed in Deputy Huskin's vehicle.

After speaking with the victim, she stated that he had been pulling on the door handle, screaming, 'Help me, Let me in." all while trying to gain access to the residence. He knocked signs off

the door and wall that were being held their with a Command Strip. She was clearly extremely fearful and she was shaking during the entirety of the event. Deputy Miller then went to speak with Richard who was extremely under the influence of intoxicants and speaking in incoherent sentences that didn't make sense. Shepherd was also unsteady on his feet and moving almost uncontrollably further indicating possible narcotic impairment. Richard Shepherd was then placed under arrest for Aggravated Criminal Trespass, Vandalism, and Public Intoxication and moved to Deputy Stanley's vehicle for transport to the jail.

Richard was then transported to the jail without further incident. This did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee

Kristen Marquardt, 50, Red Wolf Way Lenoir City, was charged with DUI.

Deputy Harrison LCSO, was dispatched to the area of Highway 70 and N Wilkerson Lane in reference to a reckless driver. The complainant advised a silver Hyundai was driving at multiple inconsistent speeds and almost being hit by other vehicles. Once Deputy Harrison was able to get in the area, the complainant advised the vehicle turned into the

driveway of Red Wolf Way and it appeared to be turning back around to leave the residence. Once on scene, Deputy Harrison observed the driver, Kristen Marquardt, passed out in the driver's seat with the vehicle still in drive as it was slowly rolling backward out of the driveway. After pulling on the door handle and knocking on the window, the deputy was able to wake Marquardt up and advise her to put the vehicle in park. At this point, the deputy had her exit the vehicle and began

speaking with her. Marquardt exhibited slow and sluggish movements and was very unsteady on her feet. While speaking with her she denied taking any prescription medication, drugs, and/or alcohol. Marquardt did consent to SFSTs and performed poorly on all tests. Once the deputy placed Marquardt in custody she stated she took two 10mg muscle relaxer pills at 6 am and 2 pm, and also stated she takes multiple other medications for various medical reasons. A consent search of the vehicle was conducted, and the deputy located 3 pill bottlers containing multiple different medications that were not in the proper container. Marguardt was read implied consent and agreed to a blood draw.

Deputy Harrison transported her to Ft. Loudon Medical Center where the blood draw took place and then to the Loudon County Jail. This did occur in Loudon County Tennessee.

contacted two minor boys in different locations via OME-GLE, an internet application which provides real-time video communications. The real-time video communications with the two boys were located on Albaba's cell phone. In each of the two videos, Albaba appears in the right-hand corner of the video requesting a male child to engage in sexual conduct and Albaba promises he will do likewise when the child is finished. One video shows a child engaging in sexual conduct, the other video does Neither boy has been identified.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee; Special Agent in Charge, Rana Saoud of the Department of Homeland Security Investigations (HSI); and Acting

Resident Agent in Charge, Lesley Cochran of the United States Secret Service (USSS) Knoxville and Kentucky made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the HSI: USSS: Knoxville Police Department-Internet Crimes Against Children Unit: Tennessee Internet Crimes Against Children; Kentucky Office of Attorney General; Campbell County Sheriff's Office; and Rocky Top Police Department. This investigation was led by HSI Task Force Agent Thomas Evans.

Assistant United States Attorney Jennifer Kolman represented the United States.




