

Agg. Assault

Dennis Burnette, Cuddie Lane Loudon, was charged with, Aggravated Assault, and Interference with Emergency Call 911.

Deputy Reagan LCSO. spoke with the Victim via phone call in regards to her boyfriend making her leave their residence at Cuddie Ln. She stated that she and her boyfriend Dennis Brunette had been together for approximately 15 years, and she had lived at this residence for near that long. She stated that she had gotten into an argument with Brunette's son and had left to discontinue any further disturbance. The victim said

that Brunette told her that she is not allowed to return even to get her belongings. Deputy Reagan explained to her that she would need to be evicted from the residence. At this time, the victim stated that she would go back to get her belongings and that she did not need a Law Enforcement escort. The victim did not mention at this time any past Domestic Violence incidents between her and Brunette. Later, at 4:13 p.m., Dispatch received another call from the victim, and Deputy Reagan spoke with her again via phone. On this phone call, victim informed the deputy that she had returned to Cuddie Ln to collect her belongings and was met by

Brunette. Hunt stated that when she entered the residence, Brunette proceeded to assault her with his fists. She said Brunette pushed her towards the door, grabbed her by her throat, and threw her out the door onto the gravel driveway. Hunt stated that the assault caused bruising to much of her body as well as breaking the skin and causing bleeding from her shoulder, hands, and arms. The victim stated that she attempted to call Emergency

Services with her cellphone, Brunette approached her and hit her phone out of her hand and proceeded to stomp on the phone. The victim said that she left and drove to a friend's house on Elm Ln, where she called 911 from the friend's phone. Deputy Curtis, Cpl. Sartin, as well as EMS responded out to the residence on Elm Ln and confirmed the injuries that the victim sustained. Deputy Curtis collected a

written statement from the victim and read the victim's rights form to her. Cpl. Sartin collected pictures of the injuries. During this, Deputy staged at the intersection of Cuddie Ln. and Webb Dr. Cpl. Sartin sent me the photos, and the deputy observed lacerations to Hunt's hands, arms, and shoulder. The pictures also show blood on her shirt and pants, as well as a discoloration to the left and right sides of her throat. Cpl. Sartin and Deputy Curtis met me at 195 Cuddie Ln in an attempt to make contact with Brunette but were unsuccessful. This did happen in

For golf reservations, veterans should call the course they would like to play to claim their free round. A list of golf courses and booking windows can be found here.

In 2019, the General Assembly approved a year-round 50% discount on camping and cabin fees for veterans with a 100% total service-connected disability. Reservations must be made less than 30 days before arrival.

All Tennessee resident veterans receive 50% off on standard nightly rates for camping from December through February. Premium sites are excluded. Reservations can be made up to a year in advance, or 30 days in advance on holiday weeks.

Both discounts can be applied when booking online here using the discounts button

Veterans must show a valid ID, proof of veteran status and/or their percentage of service-connected disability upon request when they check-in to the campsite or golf course.

Vandalism

Patrick Moser, 29, Northview Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Vandalism.

Deputy Frye LCSO and Deputy Parks were dispatched to Paoli Trace 2351 in reference to Vandalism. Upon arrival, the deputy made contact with the complainant/victim who advised that someone had hit his mailbox and spray painted his garage door. The deputy observed the mailbox laying on the road (Pictures will be in the Images Tab). Deputy Parks asked victim to roll the garage door down to see the damage, in which we observed the words, "B Josh" and "Cheater" spray painted (Pictures will be in the Images Tab). The victim neighbor at Paoli Trace 2351, texted him at approximately 1630 to advise him that someone had hit his mailbox and spray painted the garage door.

Victim stated that he left for work around 0730 this morning with no damage to his property.

Victim advised us that Patrick Moser was accusing him of having an affair with his wife who works under Joshua in the Outpatient Rehab Department at Fort Loudoun Medical Center.

Victim advised Frye and Deputy Parks that he knew it was Patrick because he had been showing up to his work. On 07/27/2024, the hospital security officer, called the victim to let him know that Patrick was asking for his location. The victim advised us that he had showed up wearing a weapon holster, but no weapon. The victim stated that he knew he had showed up on Saturday because he left the storm door propped.

The victim advised us that Patrick had paid someone to research where he lives, as well as his phone number. There have been communications between the victim and Patrick. However, the victim deleted them due to being afraid of being fired for bringing personal issues to

work. The deputy asked the victim if he had any call logs between the two in which he advised us, they were deleted as well. The deputy asked for Patrick's number in which he gave it to her, as well as the road he lived on. The victim stated that complaint observed Patrick in a Blue Ford Ranger.

The victim stated, "This guy is gonna kill me." He told us that he had a 3-year-old daughter that resided at the residence which causes him to be in

fear. The deputy asked him if he wanted to press charges, in which he said, "Yes."


The property value for the mailbox is \$300, and the garage door, \$1700. The photos taken are above in the Images Tab.

Warrants were issued and Deputies responded to Northview Drive to attempt to locate Patrick Moser. Moser was located, placed under arrest and transported to Loudon County Detention Center.

Examples of identification include driver's license, voter registration or other valid identification with address. Proof of veteran status includes a certificate of discharge (DD214). Veterans Benefits Administration benefit card, retired military card or similar.

Samantha Kennedy, 37, County Road 350 Sweetwater, was charged Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II & IV, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth x2, Poss. of Drug Para. x2, and Assisting other Agency.

The Loudon County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit executed a residential search warrant for controlled sub-

stances inside a camper located at Murrays Chapel Road Lot 31, Sweetwater, Loudon County, TN. Investigators conducted a search of the camper and recovered approximately 15.16g of Methamphetamine along a glass pipe used to ingest Methamphetamine, located in the main living space of the camper, on a couch. The items were located in a small black zipped pouch. These items were within immediate reach of Samantha Kennedy when the Patrol Division initially made contact with Ms. Kennedy for an outstanding felony warrant. The black zipped pouch was located near two backpacks, both of which contained items belonging to Samantha Kennedv. Investigators recovered a dark blue cellular device, believed to be a Samsung, which belonged to Samantha Kennedy. This device was seized and stored in the Nar-

cotics Office, pending further investigation. The suspected narcotics were tested via a TruNarc device which yielded a positive result for Methamphetamine. Ms. Kennedy is currently in custody at the Loudon County Jail for

outstanding felony warrants. Ms. Kennedy is additionally being charged with unlawful drug paraphernalia and Manufacture, Sale, and Delivery of Methamphetamine. All the above did occur in Loudon County TN.






