

Browning's misappropriation resulted in the department operating on and having less fuel on reserve than believed by department employees. His actions put the department at risk of having insufficient fuel supplies in case of a natural disaster or large

Based upon this investigation, in September 2024, Jason Earl Browning was indicted by the Clay County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$10,000 and three counts of official misconduct. The Tennessee District Attorneys General Conference is serving as Pro Tem in this matter.

money was placed into her pocket you see JONES walk away from the register. Later that night into the early morning hours of June 3rd, 2024, JONES is then seen taking an unknown amount of money from a customer who did not provide a ticket for a meal but paid at the front register of the establishment. JONES is then seen creating a ticket for the said customer and placing an unknown amount of currency into her pocket. It was reported again that on June 3rd, 2024, at around 06:12 hours JONES is seen at the front register of the establishment taking another payment from a customer and during this transaction the customer is seen speaking with JONES at which time JONES turns the entire computer around towards the customer and began speaking with him. While reviewing the camera footage you can see the customer attempting to make an unknown transaction with his phone and never physically pay with either a debit/credit card or cash and leave the establishment. On the back of the ticket that was provided JONES is seen writing a username of an unknown account "ligmapiglet". During the investigation it was determined that JONES did deprive her place of employment, Waffle House by theft.

Deputy Reagan LCSO, observed a maroon Honda Ridgeline (BRX7640) on Shaw Ferry Road traveling towards Creekwood Park Blvd. The deputy observed this vehicle to have the passenger side brake light out. The deputy conducted a traffic stop at Shaw Ferry Rd.

A field weight of the substance was 5.2g. At that time, the deputy took Davidson into custody and read him Mi-



Deputy Brockwell LCSO, arrived at Sunnyside Road for an armed person call. Before arrival Dispatch notified the deputy that the victim, stated that the offender, Scottie Bogle, has left the residence and was headed back towards Monroe County. 




