dispatched to the area of Highway 321 and Fog Hill Lane for reports of a Red Dodge Dart swerving all over the road and into oncoming traffic. Officers were able to locate the vehicle and attempted a traffic stop however the vehicle failed to stop and merged onto 175 South. While in the area of the 76 on-ramps, Deputy Ezell observed a vehicle matching that description traveling on 175 South. After catching up to the vehicle, the deputy observed the vehicle pass a Semi truck on the shoulder and it was at this point in time the deputy activated his emergency equipment and

attempted to stop the vehicle however, the vehicle failed to stop. The deputy then pursued the vehicle from approximately the 74-mile marker to the 72-mile marker, when the vehicle made an abrupt turn and exited onto the 72 off-ramp. While on scene it was learned that Mr. Butler had multiple warrants out of Knox and Anderson County it was also learned that Mr. Butler was driving with a suspended driver's license. Mr. Butler was then cleared by EMS and then transported to the Loudon County Detention Facility without incident.

Heath Cadle,28, Hill Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault

Officer H. Wilkes LCPD, was dispatched to W Hills Dr in reference to a physical domestic. Upon arrival, contact was made with the victim (mother) in the front yard, and Heath Cadle (son) on the front porch. While officers spoke with both parties, both

Heather Garza,34, Big Sandy Road Philadelphia, was charged with Criminal Court Capias, Simple Possession, and Contraband in Penal In-



ing the kids to ask her what those words meant. The victim has had previous orders of protection out on Mr. Rice for her and her kids. The victim attorney and workplace has sent a cease and desist to Mr. Rice due to his slandering on social media.


