ly alerted to the driver-side door seam of the vehicle. During a probable cause search, Harrison located approximately 2.26g of meth, and a meth pipe with residue in the driver seat back pocket concealed within a glasses case. After his search, the deputy spoke with Lawson who denied possession of the narcotics. The deputy spoke with Burchfield who was sitting directly behind the driver seat, and she also denied possession. Based on the totality of the circumstances, both Lawson and Burchfield were placed in custody. While en route to the jail, Burchfield advised Deputy Huskins she had narcotics concealed on her person. Once on scene, the jail staff located a meth pipe and 2 clear baggies containing approximately 1.26g of meth concealed within her underwear. This did occur in



of 18 U.S.C. § 2252(a)(2), and Possession of Child Pornography, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252(a)(4)(b), on February 23, 2024.

According to filed court documents, Price solicited women throughout the United States to molest their children and then send him images of the abuse. Price confessed to law enforcement, and some of the women throughout the U.S. have also been charged by federal or state authorities.

"As the court records show, Price's conduct was depraved and outrageous," said United States Attorney Francis M.

Hamilton III. "Our office is committed to pursuing, uncovering, and prosecuting to the full extent of the law the criminals who sexually victimize children.'

"Children are among the most vulnerable members of our community, and we must protect them in any way we can. This case is a great example of the work that can be done when state, federal, and local law enforcement agencies collaborate across state We will continue to lines. work diligently with our partners to identify and investigate those who engage in this predatory behavior to ensure the safety of our children,'

said Special Agent in Charge Joseph E. Carrico of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

Law enforcement agencies participating in the joint investigation which led to the conviction of Price included the FBI and the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office.

Assistant United States Attorney James Brooks prosecuted the case in coordination with Special Assistant United States Attorney Charles D. Minor, who is assigned to the United States Department of Justice to combat child sex offenses in partnership with the Hamilton County District Attorney General's Office.

This case was investigated

as part of Project Safe Childhood (PSC), a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006, by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorney's Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, PSC marshals federal, state, and local resources to locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who sexually exploit children, and to identify and rescue victims. Brooke Kiser, 33, Homeless Loudon, was charged with, Theft of Property, and Burglary.

Officer G. Butler LCPD, was dispatched to Lakeway Urgent Care regarding a theft that had occurred there earlier. Upon arrival, the officer made contact with the complainant/victim inside Lakeway Urgent Care. Victim advised that a female who was sitting outside in the grass in front of the building later identified as Brooke Ann Kiser reached into his vehicle a 2006 Toyota Sienna Van blue in color and took a can of Snuff Tobacco out of it. The victim had not given Brooke Kiser his effective consent to reach into his vehicle or to take any items out of the vehicle. When speaking with Brooke regarding the incident she stated that she did take a can of Snuff tobacco and that she took it out of the van parked in front of Lakeway Urgent Care, the same van owned by the victim. While attempting to get camera footage of the incident, Dr. Sanabria of Lakeway Urgent Care advised that his Tesla Cybertruck has a camera and possibly captured footage of the what had occurred. Officer J. Robinson was able to view the camera footage of the Tesla Cybertruck owned by Dr. which did show the above offender Brooke Ann Kiser reaching into the passenger side window of the victim's van attempting to commit a theft and removing the can of tobacco out of it without having consent to do so while also knowingthe victim property without his effective consent. Upon which the officer placed the listed offender Brooke Ann Kiser into custody and she was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. 
