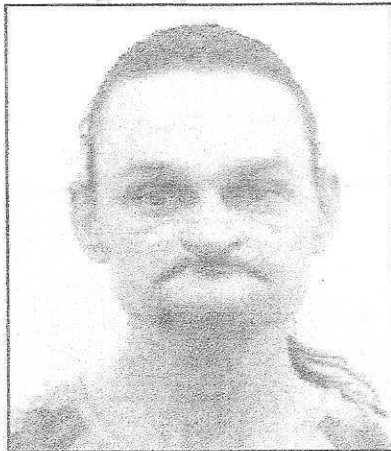

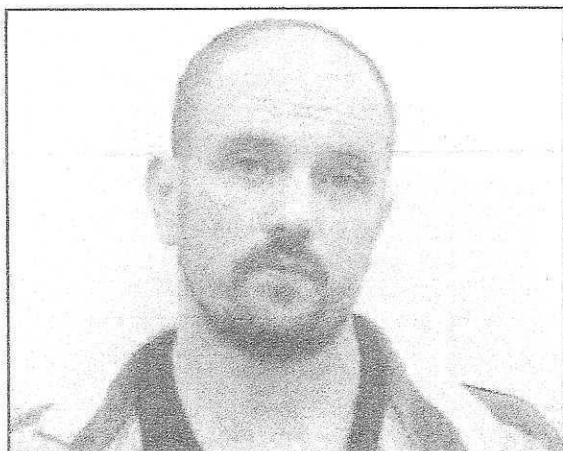

Humphreys Co. Woman Schemed to Take Husband's Pension After He Went Missing

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office, working with assistance from the Tennessee Department of Treasury and Finance and Administration, has revealed a scheme by Amy Anglea, of Waverly, to defraud the State of Tennessee of at least \$354,482.10.

Anglea's husband, Charles Anglea, was reported missing in

2010. At the time of his disappearance, he was receiving health insurance and pension benefits from the state.

Investigators determined that after her husband's disappearance, Amy Anglea repeatedly falsified government documents and signed her husband's name, which has allowed her to continue to receive his benefits for years.

Anglea misappropriated \$238,688.54 in state pension benefits and \$115,793.56 in health insurance benefits up through December 2023.

In February 2024, the Humphreys County Grand Jury indicted Amy Anglea on one count of theft of property over \$250,000,

Terry Ingram, 48, Bethel Drive Lenoir City, was charged with, Domestic Assault x2, and Public Intoxication.

Officer C. Fine LCPD, was dispatched to Bethel Dr. in reference to a physical domestic. Upon arrival the officer made contact with the victims. While speaking with both subjects, victim 1 stated that her ex-husband, Terry Ingram, was staying at her house for the weekend due to them having children together. She stated that he began drinking alcohol and became irate, so she had him sit outside for a while in attempts to diffuse. She

then stated that Terry began to knock on the door asking to come in and get his alcohol, and when she opened the door, he forcefully pushed his way into the residence. She stated that after he forced his way into the residence he walked to the fridge. Victim 2 then opened the fridge door and he stated that Terry got in his face and questioned what he was doing there to which victim 2 responded, "Protecting my mom".

Victim 2 stated that Terry then became physical with him punching him and pushing him. Victim 2 stated that after a brief altercation Terry then got up and walked out of the residence due to Terry's younger son entering

the kitchen where they were fighting. After acquiring this information, the officer then left the residence and went to the Lenoir City Fire Department at Pearl Dr, where Officer Mendez and Sgt. Ketner made contact with Terry. Upon arrival the officer noticed that Terry was wearing two different shoes while walking down the road

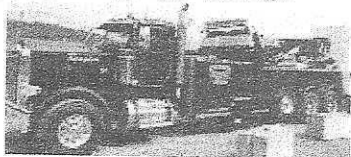
and appeared to be unsteady on his feet causing him to be a danger to himself and others. At the resident officers also observed empty beer cans and liquor bottles in the house.

Brandon Myers, 32, Holt Drive Loudon, was charged with, Domestic Assault.

Officer Bonilla LPD, was dispatched to Holt Drive in reference to a domestic. Upon arrival the complainant, Brandon Myers, stated that he had been assaulted by his father, the victim, due to a disagreement over politics. Brandon stated that his father pushed him into the wall. There was visible damage to the wall, and a scratch mark from the wall on Brandon's back. However, the victim and the complainant's grandfather, stated that Brandon threw himself into the wall dramatically by pushing off of the wall in front of him, and that he had been drinking and was possibly impaired by some type of drug. Brandon did have the smell of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his person. Due to the totality of the circumstances the officer could not determine who the

primary aggressor was.

At 3:19pm, officers were dispatched back out to Holt Drive for a follow up. According to statements given on scene, the incident had escalated after officers had left the scene previously. The victim the grandfather, stated that Brandon had gotten into his face repetitively in the dining room making numerous remarks. The victim also stated that when he asked Brandon to stop, he would not, so he tried to get away from him by walking toward the living room. However, Brandon kept placing his body in front of the victim in order to keep him from leaving the situation. The victim stated that he felt threatened by Brandon. Due to the circumstances, the officer was able to determine Brandon Myers as the primary aggressor. He was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident for Domestic Assault. This did occur in the City of Loudon, TN.

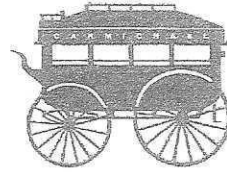

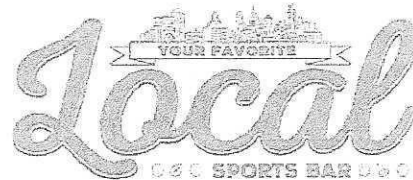

Amberlee Beck, 49, Hon-
eysuckle Road Loudon, was
charged with, Aggravated
Criminal Trespassing.

Joshua Beck, 42, Home-
less Lenoir City, was
charged with, Aggravated
Criminal Trespassing, and
Theft of Service.

Deputy Reagan LCSO,
responded to Hwy 11 E in
reference to trespassers on
the property. Upon arriv-
al, the deputy made contact
with the Complainant. He
stated that he was the own-
er of the property and he has
had a male that has attempt-
ed to take over the property.
He noted that he has tried to
make contact with the male
but has not been successful.
He stated that he arrived at
the address and attempted to

go into the rundown house
that is on the property, but he
heard someone inside. Due
to being afraid of possible
harm, he called for Law En-
forcement to respond. Dep-
uty Brewer, Deputy McCall,
and Reagan walked down to
the house and attempted to
make contact. The deputy
knocked on the door, and he
could hear someone inside.
The door that the deputy
knocked on opened slight-
ly, and he made announce-
ments.

Deputy Brewer knocked
on a back window and made
contact with two individ-
uals. They walked outside
and complied with com-
mands. Deputy McCall and
Reagan detained both in-
dividuals. Deputy McCall
and Deputy Brewer cleared
the remainder of the house.

While clearing the building,
Deputy McCall observed
multiple extension cords that
ran out of the house through
a window and into the woods
next to the house. The cords
were connected to a heater
and multiple lights through-
out the house. Both individ-
uals were read their Miranda
Warning and waived their
rights. The deputy identified
the individuals as Joshua and
Amberlee Beck.

Both stated that they knew
they were not allowed to be
in the house and have been
staying in it since October
2024. Joshua was asked
about the extension cords
and admitted that they were
run out of the house and con-
nected to a storage building
owned by the victim. Joshua
stated that he has been in the
house since October 2024

and has had the cords since
then. Joshua was not given
permission by the victim to
use the power. The victim
provided utilities statements
from the previous year to
show where his bills have
gone up. The estimated ex-
penses from October 2024
to January 2025 are around
\$400.

After gathering all evi-
dence and collecting all per-
tinent information, The dep-
uty placed both individuals
under arrest and transported
them to the Loudon County
Jail. The deputy spoke with
LCUB to confirm if the lines
running through the ground
were their main power lines.
The LCUB representative
stated that it was not and he
disconnected the lines to pre-
vent any further damage to
property.

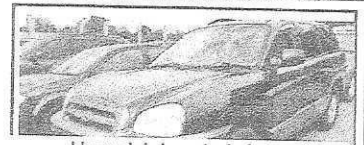

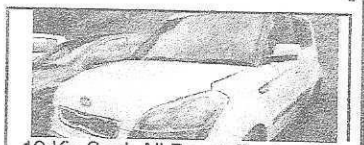

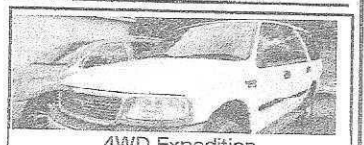

Mira Francis, 18, East Emory Road Knoxville, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Officer Carroll LCPD, responded to Crooked Oak Dr. in reference to a physical domestic. Upon arrival, the officer observed the bedroom window of the house to be open, and could hear a female crying from within the house.

The officer made contact with a male subject, who was identified as the victim. While speaking with the

Angelica Jenkins, 29, Homeless Loudon, was charged with Public Intoxication.

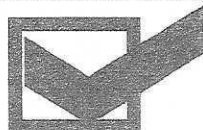

Police beat

Randall Richesin, 42, Murry Chapel Road Sweetwater, was charged with, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Poss. of Drug Para., Domestic Assault, and Contraband in Penal Institution.

Deputy Ezell LCSO, responded to Murrays Chapel Road for reports of an officer investigation. Once the deputy arrived at the scene, he made contact with the complainant who stated that her stepson son identified as Randall Richesin the 2nd has threatened to kill his great aunt. The deputy made contact with the victim and she provided the deputy with the following summarized statement;

The victim stated she was in her bedroom when Randall entered the room holding a club and said, "He was going to settle it all in an hour or two." the victim stated Randall then began Cussing at her and started throwing items around the house. The victim stated she then retreated from her home and went to the complainants house to get away from Randall, and it was at that point in time law enforcement was called. While speaking with the complaint and the victim, stated that Randall has threatened the victim

life on multiple occasions and the victim did state she does fear for her safety due to Randall's actions. Deputies then responded to Murrays Chapel Road where both the victim and Randall resided in an attempt to make contact with Randall. Deputies were able to make contact with Randall and during a consensual search of his person Deputies located a clear baggy containing a white crystal-like substance along with a straw and two bundles of tinfoil commonly used to smoke narcotics. Randall was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Detention Center without incident. Shortly after leaving the detention center, the deputy was contacted by Correction officers who stated they had located another clear baggy containing a white crystal-like substance inside Randall's sock. The deputy responded to the Detection Center where he collected the baggy for evidence. Lt. Ezell was notified of the findings and a TruNarc Test was conducted. Both substances tested positive for methamphetamines. All evidence has been collected and logged. This did happen in Loudon County, Tennessee.

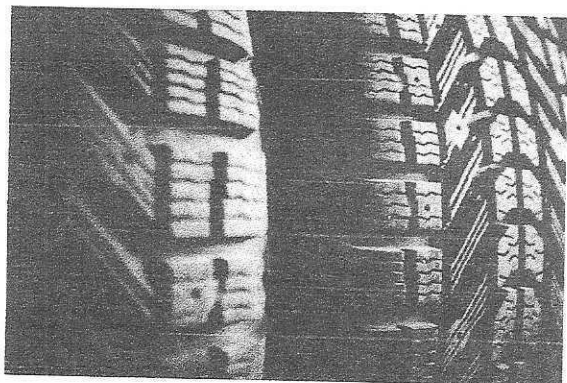
