Dennis Allen Gaal Sentenced To 25 Years For Engaging In Interstate Travel For The Purpose Of Engaging In Illicit Sexual Conduct

Dennis Allen Gaal, 50. currently of Chattanooga, Tennessee, was sentenced to 25 years by the Honorable Travis R. Mc-Donough, United States District Judge, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Chattanooga. Following his incarceration, Gaal will be on supervised release for life, and he will be required to register with state sex offender registries and comply with special sex offender condi-

ence to a welfare check. The officer made contact with the witness, who stated that they had seen the male, later identified as, Nicholas Holmes, inhale a substance through his nose. The complainant wrote that when they exited the store, they noticed Nicholas slumped over in his driver seat. The officer made contact with the driver, Nicholas. The officer was able to see a bag with a white powder substance in the passenger seat. Nicholas had very glossy eyes that also appeared to be very red, bloodshot, and he appeared very delayed in

his movements. After being questioned about the bag with white powder and the bag of pills sitting in the passenger seat, in plain view, Nicholas advised that he had not taken anything and was just very tired, The officer was able to locate another bag of blue pills sitting near the gear shift on the car. The long white pills had markings GG249, and the bag of small blue pills had markings with the letter M in a box and 30 on the opposite side. The bag of white powder substance was believed to be Cocaine (Schedule II), which was later tested and confirmed by Drug Task Force Agent Cody Fritts. The blue pills

were believed to be Fentanyl pills (Schedule II), based on markings, but were identified as Oxycodone through Google, Pill Finder. The white, elongated pills with markings GG249 were Identified as alprazolam (Schedule IV) with Google, pill identifier. Drug Task Force agent Cody Fritts was contacted in regards to the seizure and testing of the narcotics. The narcotics

were seized and measured: Cocaine: 3.35G (see attached picture)33 dosage units per Agent Cody Fritts. Alprazolam:36.25 pills/ 9.74g (See attached Picture). Fentanyl:94.25 pills/ 11.05g. Nicholas was placed into custody and transported to Loudon County Jail without further incident. The above did take place in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN.

Officers with LPD, received a call of an Armed Person at Shubert St. The caller victim1 advised 911 that her daughter Ms. Barbara Ruckel pointed a rifle at her and her son victim 2. After speaking with both parties it was determined that after a verbal altercation occurred Ms. Ruckel brandished a black .22 Ruger rifle while sitting in the driver's seat of her vehicle in their driveway. It was determined Ms. Ruckel did not point the gun at the victims. Both victims were in fear of their lives and are going to take the necessary steps to obtain an Order of Protection. Ms. Ruckel was placed into custody and was transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. She is being charged with two counts of Aggravated Assault. Jeffrey Dingman, 29, Browder Hollow Road Lenoir City, was charged with, Domestic Assault.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Dept. responded to Browder Hollow Road, Lot 38 to investigate a Domestic Assault complaint.

Upon arrival the officer observed a male identified as Jeffrey

Dingman (offender) speaking with Deputies Brewer and Curtis who responded as mutual aid. The officer then entered the residence and encountered the victim who is (pregnant) who stated that she and Mr. Dingman were arguing over personal and alcohol issues while she was holding their 1.5 year old son. The victim explained that Mr. Dingman grabbed her by the face causing a bleeding injury to the inside of her mouth and slapped her before pulling their son from her grasp. The victim explained that during the incident, Mr. Dingman pushed and pulled her arms leaving raised red marks about her wrists consistent with fingernails. The officer did observe the injury inside her mouth as well as the scratches above both wrists.

The officer then spoke with Mr. Dingman who stated that the victim was mistreating their other 6 year old son and he tried to intervene when she attacked him. A strong smell of an alcoholic beverage was present about Mr. Dingman's person and no evidence of injury was observed about his person. Based upon the incident description and the evidence of injury displayed on the victim, Mr. Dingman was taken into custody for Domestic Assault and transported to the Loudon County

tions during his supervised release.

As part of the plea agreement filed with the court, Gaal agreed to plead guilty to an indictment charging him with one count of interstate travel for the purpose of engaging in illicit sexual conduct, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2423(b). Gaal, a registered sex offender from Mississippi, traveled to Chattanooga in December 2023, intending to sexually molest a 10-month-old child. In

fact, Gaal had been communicating with a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) who was posing as a person with access to the child. Gaal noted in the online discussions with the undercover agent that the sexual abuse would be "a dream come true." He arrived in Chattanooga with gifts for the notional child, including Christmas outfits, a stuffed animal, and a rattle. When Gaal arrived, he was arrested and has remained in custody since his arrest. "The defendant, while already a convicted sex offender, traveled to Tennessee to sexually molest a 10-month-old child," said Francis M. Hamilton III, U. S. Attomey for the Eastern District of Tennessee. 'The facts are outrageous and disturbing. We are dedicated to prosecuting offenders like this to the full extent of the law."

"Exploitation of children offenses are heinous and leave an immeasurable impact on victims," said Special Agent in Charge Joseph E. Carrico of the FBI Nashville Field Office. "To protect our children, the FBI will continue to work alongside our law enforcement partners to identify, investigate, and bring sexual predators to justice."

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the FBI and the investigation was led by FBI Special Agent Samuel

Assistant United States Attorney James T. Brooks and Special Assistant United States Attorney Charlie Minor with the Hamilton County District Attorney's Office, represented the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood (PSC), a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006, by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorney's Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section. PSC marshals federal, state, and local resources to locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who sexually exploit children, and to identify and rescue victims. 




