Officer M. Flynn LPD, was patrolling on Highway 72 when Officer Flynn Observed a Toyota Sienna (TN tag of 003BNJT) traveling with a drivers side headlight out. continue its current practices for storing, managing, and protecting customer data, 23andMe intends to sell substantially all its assets as part of the bankruptcy process. Those assets include personal data and DNA samples provided by 23andMe customers, and it is unclear how a purchaser will treat such sensitive information and genetic material.


Due to this uncertainty, General Skrmetti is notifying 23andMe customers of their rights to download their personal data from their account, delete their account, and instruct the company to destroy their biological sample and not use it for research purposes.

"Our genetic information is some of our most personal data, giving insight about not just us but our families," said Attornev General Skrmetti. "People trusted 23andMe with their DNA to learn more about who they are, and now the company appears poised to sell that incredibly sensitive data to unknown buyers. Any Tennessee consumer

who wants to delete their data and ensure their sample is destroyed should follow the step-by-step instructions provided on our website."

Tennessee's Genetic Information Privacy Act (GIPA), which went into effect in July 2023, requires companies to protect consumers', private information and to provide them with the ability to access their data, delete their data and account, and destroy their biological sample. 23andMe's website offers a process for consumers to modify their preferences to opt out of the use of their genetic data for research.

23andMe customers can find information on how to download a copy of their genetic reports, delete their genetic data from 23andMe, destroy their test sample, and opt out of research

tion of Implied Consent. Sgt. Pesterfield LCSO, witnessed a black Toyota Camry turn on Poplar Street from Highway 11 in Loudon and stop in the middle of the road on Poplar Street. The driver stayed in the middle of the road for about thirty seconds before turning left into a business parking lot at the intersection of Commerce Street and Alma Place. I also saw that the driver had vomited on himself. When the deputy asked why the doors to the vehicle were open, he said that it was because he was vomiting. The deputy asked the driver if he had consumed alcohol, which he denied multiple times. When asked why the deputy could smell alcohol coming from his person, he responded that he didn't know. When asked what made him throw up, he said, "Nervousness." the deputy then asked the driver, now identified as Mr. Joshua Dugan, to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFSTs), which he refused. The deputy placed Mr. Dugan in custody at that time. After being read the TN Implied Consent Advisement, he also refused to submit a blood or breath sample for chemical testing. 
