KNOX COUNTY MAN SENTENCED TO 60 YEARS IMPRISONMENT FOR TWO COUNTS OF PRODUCTION OF CHILD PORNOGRAPHY

Matthew Estes, 26, currently of Knox Tennessee, County, was sentenced to 720 months by the Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, United States District Judge, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville. Following his release, Estes will be on lifetime supervision and will be required to register with state sex offender registries and comply with special sex offender conditions.

As part of the plea agreement filed with the court, Estes agreed to plead guilty to an indictment charging him with two counts of production of child pornography in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2251(a).

According to the filed court documents, on October 13, 2017, the Knoxville Police Department -Internet Crimes against Chil-



Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was in the area near the intersection of Shaw Ferry Road at Town Creek Road East. While in the area the officer observed a red Nissan pickup truck disregard a posted stop sign by not coming to a complete stop at the four way stop intersection located at Town Creek Road East and Shaw Ferry Road. The officer then initiated a traffic stop on the Nissan pickup truck where it continued until It pulled into the driveway on Shaw Ferry Road located in Lenoir City, TN. Upon the traffic stop the driver who was identified as Kenneth Collins quickly exited and walked to rear of the truck where the officer met with him. while the female passenger remained in the passenger seat of the truck, the female was identified as Brittney Van Der Veen.

Both subjects showed signs of being physically nervous during the traffic stop. During the traffic stop, COLLINS could not provide a driver's license and stated that he did not have a valid license. Central dispatch advised that COLLINS was showing to have a revoked license status out of the state of Tennessee. While speaking with both COLLINS and VAN DER VEEN the officer received verbal consent to search the pickup truck. The officer was advised prior to his search of the truck that they both had hypodermic needles inside of a black bag which was contained inside of a larger blue bag. Verbal consent to search the black bag that contained the hypodermic needles was granted where the officer located a white container that had a small bag containing a gray/ white powder like substance believed to by fentanyl (approx. 0.54 grams) along with two cut straws that contained a gray/ white powder like residue inside of them. Both COLLINS and VAN DER VEEN were mirandized where both stated that they did not know that the bag containing the gray/white powdery substance believed to be fentanyl



Investigators concluded that Webster was working as a counselor for both Persevere in Memphis and Eagles Nest Services in Jackson at the same time.

Webster improperly received at least \$17,239.63 in unearned wages and employer-paid benefits from Persevere. Investigators deter- gation, in April 2024, Brodmined that Webster claimed to be working for both nonprofits simultaneously for 469 hours, a practice called

double-dipping.

Both Persevere and Eagles Nest requested and received salary reimbursements for Webster using TANF grant funds. Furthermore, inves-tigators reviewed Webster's case files for his mental health clients and discovered that he did not maintain any documentation to substantiate that he performed any work for Persevere.

Based upon this investierick Webster was indicted by the Shelby County Grand Jury for one count of theft of property over \$10,000.




